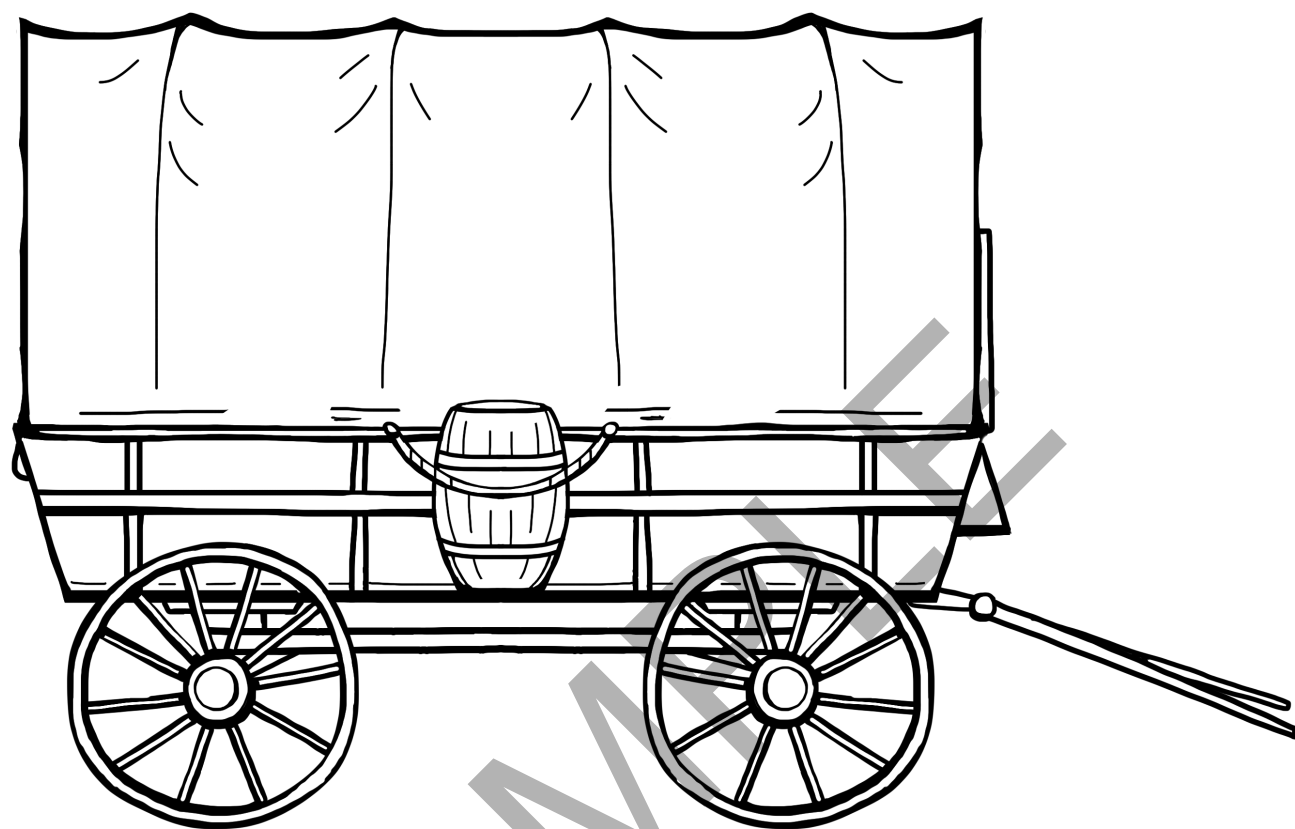
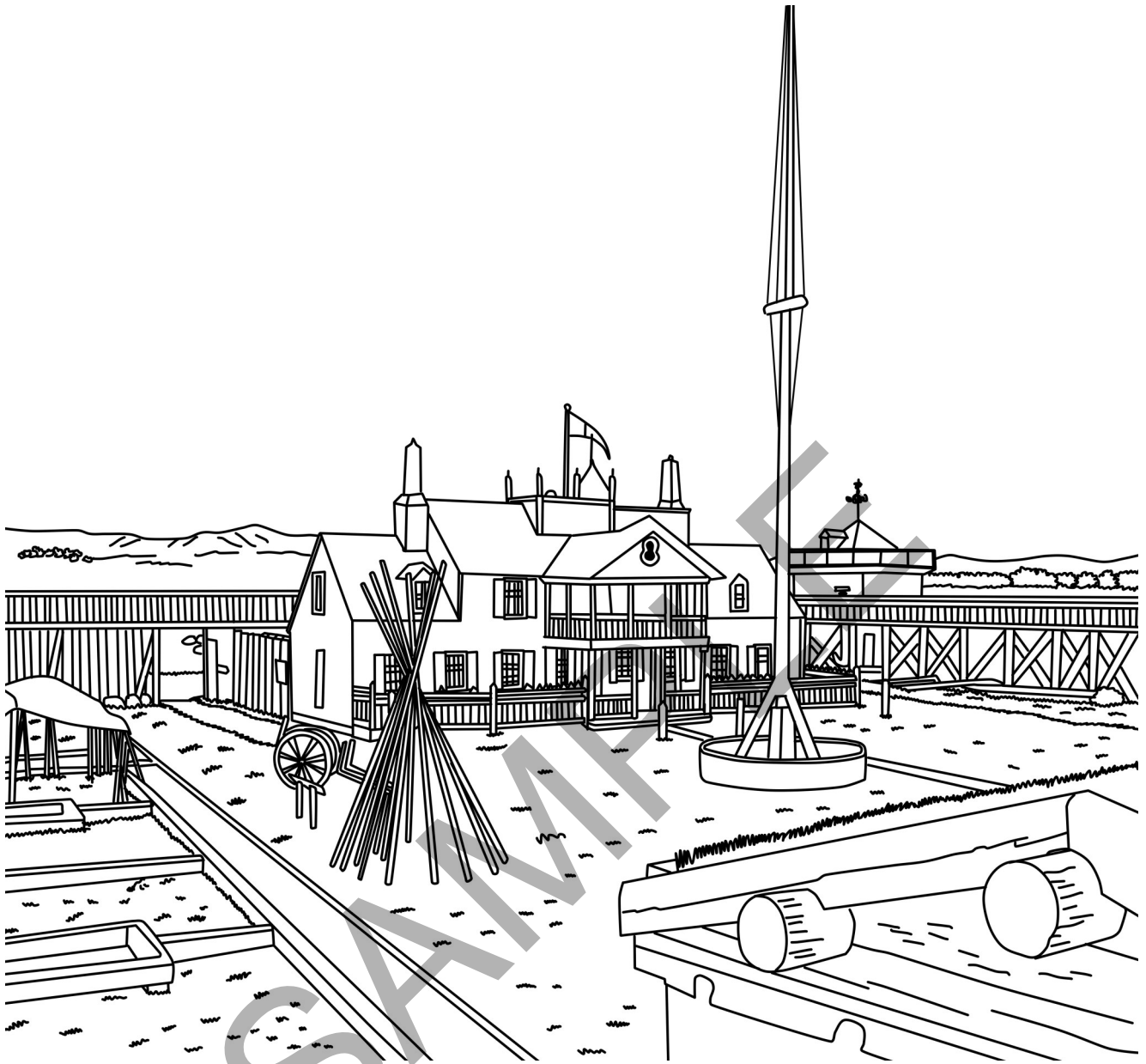




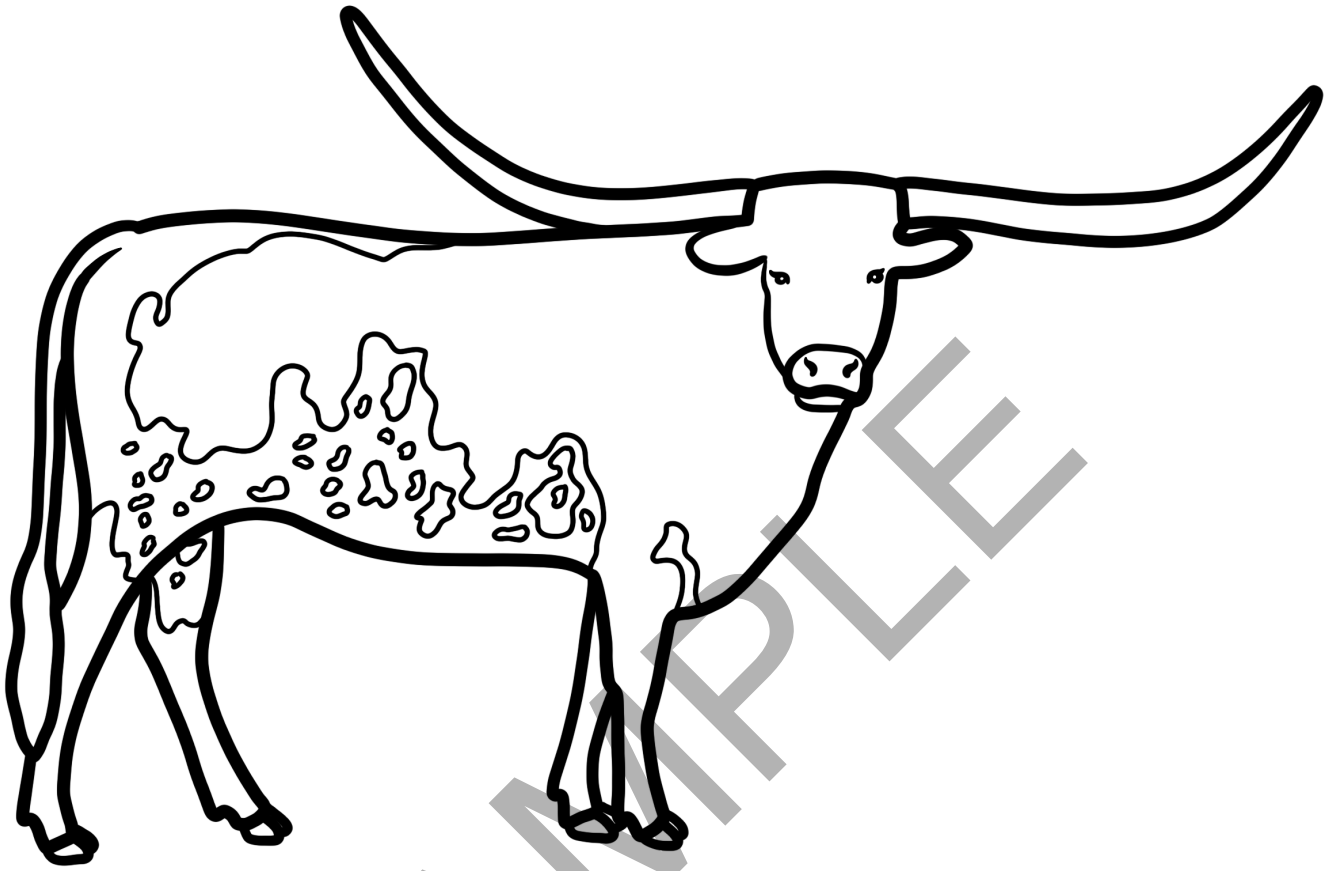

for a land grant.



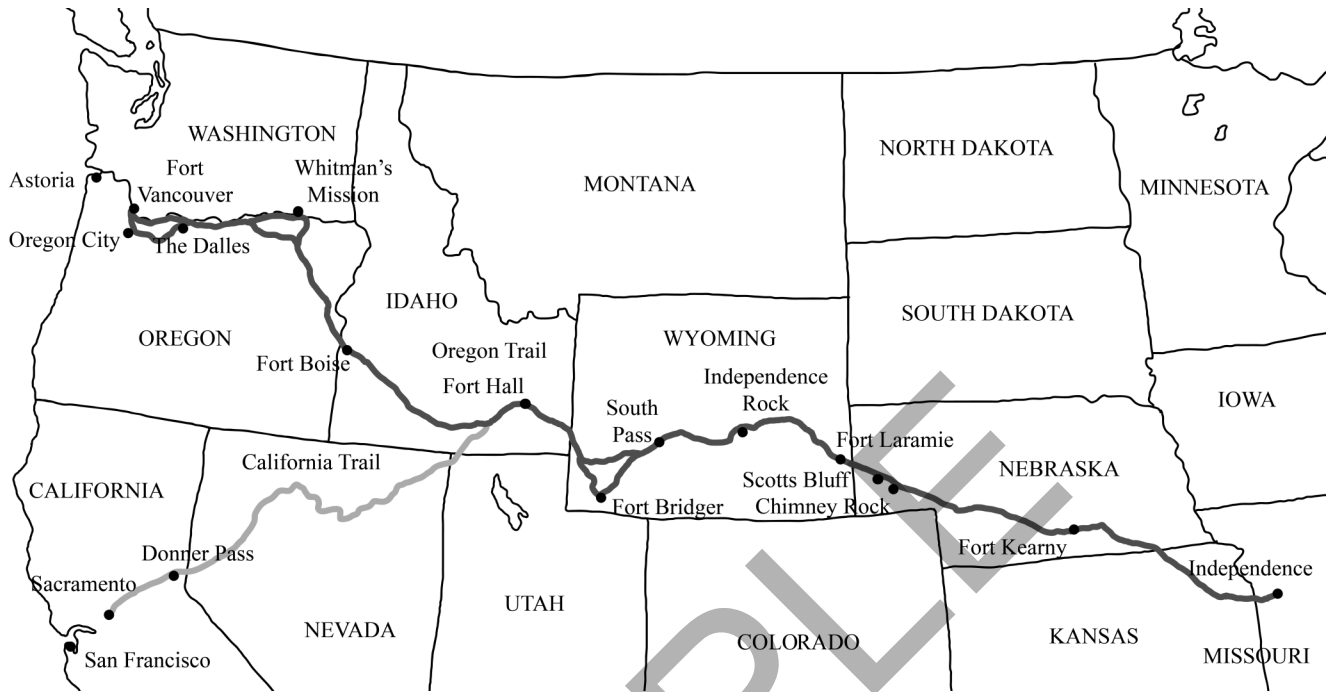
In 1864, the military

in Dakota Territory.



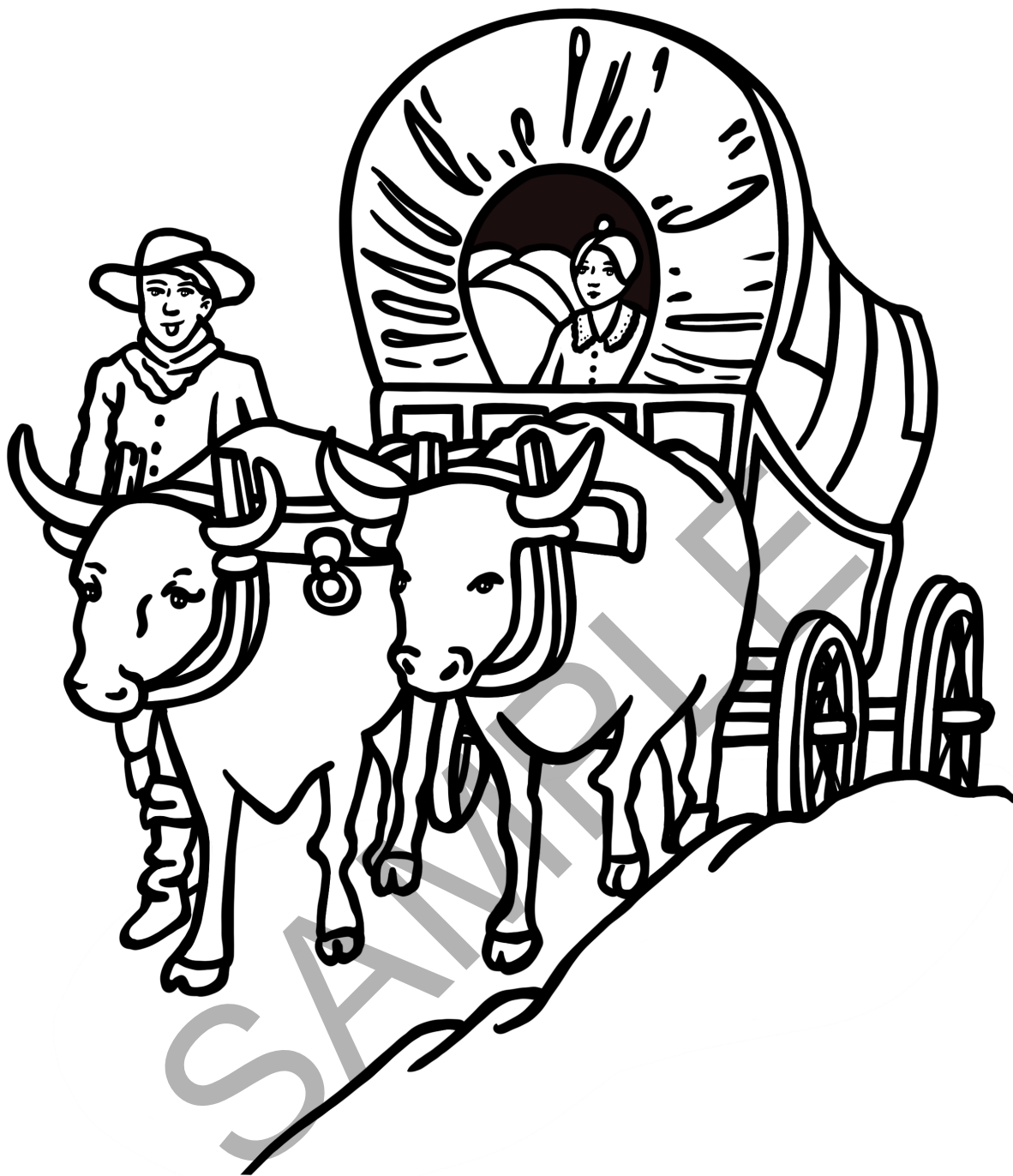
Between 1867 and
